The Licensed Midwifery curriculum prepares graduates to work in direct patient care settings as Licensed Certified Professional Midwives (LCPMs). LCPMs work in the community to independently provide comprehensive prenatal care, attend births at home and in birth centers, and provide postpartum and newborn care in a system which allows for collaboration with and referral to affiliated health care providers. Clinical education is provided at cooperating birth centers, health facilities, and in private homebirth practices. Students entering clinical Internships will be required to provide a criminal background check and drug screening test before or during each rotation. Upon completion of the program students must sit for and pass the North American Registry of Midwives exam in order to be licensed and practice in the field. Primary employment opportunities for LCPMs include birth centers and private midwifery practices. LCPMs may also be employed by state or federal government agencies and by health organizations for provision of care in the community, including health education, prenatal and/or postpartum home visitation, STI testing, nutritional counseling for the childbearing year, lactation counseling, newborn/infant assessment in the community, and postpartum depression assessment.

Program Admission Requirements

The Licensed Certified Professional Midwifery (LCPM) Program at Kennedy-King College establishes admissions requirements that are both rigorous and equity-driven, ensuring alignment with Midwifery Education Accreditation Council (MEAC) standards. Applicants must hold a high school diploma or GED and demonstrate academic readiness through prerequisite coursework in Biology I, Gen Ed Math, and English composition. In addition to academic preparation, candidates submit a personal statement, resume or CV, and two letters of recommendation, and complete an admissions interview to assess communication skills and professional readiness.

The program employs a holistic admissions process that values both academic achievement and community-based experience, such as doula practice, public health work, or grassroots birth support. Applicants from historically underrepresented groups in healthcare are strongly encouraged to apply, reflecting the program's mission to advance maternal and child health equity. By combining MEAC-compliant standards with community-centered recruitment, the LCPM program ensures a diverse pipeline of midwives prepared to meet the urgent maternal health needs of Chicago's South Side and beyond.

Admissions Requirements

- General Admission to Kennedy-King College**
 - High school diploma or GED equivalent.
 - Completion of the City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) admissions application.
 - Submission of official transcripts from all prior institutions.
- Academic Prerequisites**
 - Successful completion (grade C or higher) of the following courses:
 - English 101: Composition
 - Biology 121: Biology I
 - Math 118: Gen Ed Math (or higher)
 - Recommended: prior coursework in health sciences, social sciences, or public health.
- Program-Specific Application Materials**
 - Personal statement describing professional goals, interest in midwifery, and commitment to health equity.
 - Current resume or curriculum vitae (CV).
 - Two letters of recommendation (academic, professional, or community-based).
- Interview Requirement**
 - Admissions interview with program faculty/staff to assess readiness, communication skills, and alignment with program mission.
- Clinical Readiness**
 - Proof of required immunizations in compliance with clinical site guidelines.
 - Background check and drug screening as required by City Colleges of Chicago and clinical partners.
- Equity and Access**

- Holistic admissions review considers both academic achievement and community-based experience in birth work, doula practice, or public health.
- Applicants from historically underrepresented groups in healthcare are strongly encouraged to apply.

7. Upon Admission

- Mandatory attendance at program orientation.
